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Perhaps a clue is found in a similar passage in John chapter 9, verses 4 and 5

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The context in chapter 9, is Jesus healing a blind man, so in chapter 11, it would seem that the meaning is more general than just addressing the disciples' fears about travelling back to Judea. Also, in chapter 9, Jesus is saying that the daylight hours are for working, doing God's work.

So now, looking at chapter 11, verse 9 again

⁹ Jesus answered, 'Are there not twelve hours of daylight? Anyone who walks in the day-time will not stumble, for they see by this world's light.

"Twelve hours of daylight"? Apparently, they divided daylight into twelve equal "hours", whereas for us an hour is 60 minutes.² Well, that's something interesting about the culture, but it doesn't shed any extra light on what Jesus means.

Lastly, I have two Bible commentaries at home. They go through the whole Bible explaining each verse or section. But, now-a-days, I can look up the meaning of a particular verse at the Bible Hub, and have access to thirteen Bible commentaries.³ That's equivalent to a pile of books over a metre high. So now, putting it all together, the meaning seems to be much clearer.

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
